# What You Expect in the First Week of Kindergarten

All schools in SD43 begin the school year with a gradual entry program. The purpose of the gradual entry is create multiple opportunities for the children to begin developing an attachment to their teacher and to connect to their peers. In addition to building relationships, children in small groups will become orientated to the school and classroom environment. This will help to create a safe, caring learning environment. Also during this first week, all children and parents will be invited to participate in a Welcoming Conversations. This conversation will provide families with the opportunity to share information about their child, and begin to develop the parent/caregiver relationship. Parents will be asked to share their child's strengths and any challenges. Each school principal will send out specific gradual entry scheduling information.

#### Communication

### **Communicating Student Learning (reporting)**

- What is the process?
- When does it occur?
- How is the learning communicated?

#### **Recess and Lunch Hour**

- Who will supervise the children at recess and lunch?
- Who will supervise the children when they eat lunch?
- Will uneaten food be sent home?
- Is there a Nut-Free Policy?
- Are there Garbage/Recycling/Green Waste programs? How is it best to pack lunch?
- Are students allowed to drink juice?
- Are there any food regulations?
- Is there a hot lunch program? Do the kindergarten children participate?
- Is there a "West Coast" recess policy? (Children still play outside if it is raining)
- What weather conditions will result in an "Inside Day"?

#### School Arrival and Dismissal

- Where do the children enter and exit the building?
- Where can parents park?
- Are parents welcome in the school building, during school hours?
- Are parents/caregivers expected to wait with their child for the school bell?
- Is there a drop-off zone?
- Is there supervision before/after school?

Note – there are no crossing guards to assist children to cross street

### **School Supplies**

- Will my child require inside shoes? Are there particular requirement (e.g. to be able to be worn in gym, Velcro)
- Will my child require an extra set of clothing?
- Is there particular clothing my child needs for outside learning/play?
- Does my child need gym strip?

## **Emergency Preparedness**

What are the emergency procedures?

- Fire
- Earthquake
- Code Yellow
- Code Red

# **Parent/Caregiver Involvement**

- What are the volunteer opportunities?
- What must a parent do to volunteer? E.g. criminal record check, driver's abstract, volunteer form
- What is the Parent Advisory Council (PAC)? District Parent Advisory Council (DPAC)?

#### **Special Events**

- What types of special events happen school-wide? Classroom-based?
- How are special events communicated to families?
- Are there assemblies? Are families welcome to attend?
- Will children go on field trips? How will the learning on the field trip be articulated?
- Will there be special presentations?
- Is there a sports day/activity day?
